Preparing for Finals: Survival Guide

1.) Start early

5.) Lastly, take breaks and stay well rested!


 You won't be able to memorize or comprehend all the material at once. Balance is key - ensure that you reward learning with breaks to recharge and relax.

Position Title:	Center Student Assistant
Job Summary:	 The Center for Careers in Teaching provides comprehensive undergraduate academic advisement for Cal State Fullerton students planning for a career in teaching elementary, middle, high school or special education as well as other educational careers. The advisors in the center also collaborate with local high schools and community colleges to provide transcript evaluation, admission (freshman and transfer) advising, and career preparation through one-on-one advising, group advising and college fairs. Under the supervision of the Center Coordinator, the student assistant duties include but are not limited to: Create and maintain weekly (5-7 posts minimum) relevant and impactful social media content for CCT accounts and monitor accounts daily under the direction of Center staff; Create relevant and impactful print and electronic media to develop outreach, recruitment, & retention materials; Support and assist students with navigating Center resources and maintain a welcoming environment to all visitors; Manage Center email account; provide timely email responses; Perform general office duties, such as schedule advising appointments, provide an inviting, clean and supportive environment for students (when we return to campus), answer phones and emails, make copies, etc.; Maintain discretion and confidentiality with sensitive information; Concurrently assist advisors on projects or programs with various deadlines; Other duties as assigned.
Essential Qualifications:	Current enrollment at CSUF; Excellent interpersonal, written and verbal communication skills (writing sample will be collected during interview); Ability to interact and communicate professionally with a diverse group of students, staff, and faculty; Commitment to just, equitable, and inclusive education; Ability to manage multiple projects with ongoing interruptions with minimal supervision; Ability to use work effectively and independently; excellent critical thinking and analytical skills; Ability to work under pressure of deadlines and coordinate a wide variety of projects simultaneously.
Preferred Qualifications:	Experience using and developing content for social media platforms; Customer service experience;

	Interest in becoming an educator (K-12 or higher education).
Appointment Duration:	Student assistants are hired each semester upon satisfactory review by supervisor.
Hours and wage:	Up to 20 hours/week at \$13/hour (increases to \$14/hour January 1, 2021).
