



SCIENCE EDUCATION INTERNSHIP – Aquarium of the Pacific, Long Beach, CA The Aquarium of the Pacific is southern California's largest public Aquarium whose mission is to instill a sense of wonder, respect, and stewardship for the Pacific Ocean, its inhabitants, and ecosystems. The education team, including over 600 Education Volunteers, prides itself on making Aquarium guests feel like explorers as they learn about conservation and our 12,000 animals across multiple animal touch pools and numerous exhibits.

Interns will be participating in all or most of the aspects of the Aquarium of the Pacific's education department while learning about the Pacific Ocean and its many inhabitants. Primary responsibilities of the position include but are not limited to: leading summer camp activities, public speaking, science interpretation at our animal touch labs, supporting naturalist staff on whale watches, outreach programs, free and paid virtual programming, and presenting to the public in our Ocean Science Center.
