The Teacher Recruitment Project provides information and funds to support Multiple Subject Credential Program candidates in adding an authorization to teach math or science in the middle school.

This semester some funds have been dedicated to provide a \$2000 scholarship to each of five students who have been accepted into CSUF's Multiple Subject Credential Program for Fall 2019 and have passed one of the CSET exams required for the Foundational-Level General Science Credential or the Foundational-Level Mathematics Credential.

- passing score on one of the following CSET exams by May 6*
--Math: 211, 212
--Science: 215
