Future Teacher Action Plan

Each Semester: Schedule an appointment with an advisor from the Center for Careers in Teaching (EC-379) to ensure you are on track to complete all credential program requirements.

Sophomore year: Determine if you've met the Basic Skills requirement. If needed, prepare/take the California Basic Educational Skills Test (CBEST): <http://www.ctcexams.nesinc.com/>. Requirement must be completed for admission to a credential program.

Junior year: Attend a Credential Program Overview. Credential program prerequisites can now be included in schedule.

Senior year: Prepare/take California Subject Examinations for Teachers (CSET): <http://www.ctcexams.nesinc.com/>. Requirement must be completed for admission to a credential program.
