



TEACHGrants

General Info

The Federal TEACH Grant can provide up to \$4,000 a year to students who are completing, or plan to complete a program of study that leads to a bachelor's or master's degree, or is a post baccalaureate program designed to prepare them as highly qualified teachers in a high-need field. To receive a TEACH Grant, you must sign a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve in which you agree to:

- Teach in a high-need field,
- At an elementary school, secondary school, or educational service agency that serves students from low-income families,
- For at least four complete academic years within eight years after completing (or ceasing enrollment in) the course of study for which you received the grant.

If these requirements are not met, the TEACH Grant will be converted to an Unsubsidized Stafford Loan and interest will be assessed from the first date of disbursement.
