The Bilingual Authorization is an add-on program that empowers candidates to teach in Dual Language programs/classrooms. This authorization is for candidates that wish to teach in classrooms where the language of emphasis is appropriate for instruction and in situations where teachers use the partner language for explanation, preview-review, and interaction with families.

The Bilingual Authorization (BILA) is available for candidates and credential teachers in the Multiple Subject, Single Subject, and Education Specialists.

At CSUF we are approved to offer Bilingual Authorizations in the following languages:

- Khmer
- Korean
- Mandarin
- Spanish
- Vietnamese

Spanish Bilingual Authorization:

In addition to all the requirements for the teaching credential programs, candidates must complete the following requirements:

- Meet with program coordinator: Professor Ferran/Fernando Rodriguez-Valls for an entry interview
- Oral and written examination (equivalent to CSET LOTE Subtest III)
- Take 2 course requirements. These courses are only available to teacher candidates who have been admitted to the teaching credential program, are currently in the teaching credential program, or they have completed their teaching credential program. Teachers holding a credential could also be admitted to the program with completion of the first two requirements.
 - EDSC/EDEL 446: Methods and Inquiry for (Spanish) Bilingual Teachers or Pass CSET LOTE Subtest IV Spanish
 - EDSC/EDEL 541- Culture and Education of Latino Students or Pass CSET LOTE Subtest V Spanish
- Complete at least 10 hours of fieldwork

Khmer, Korean, Mandarin, Vietnamese Bilingual Authorization

In addition to all the requirements for the teaching credential programs, candidates must complete the following requirements:

- Meet with program coordinator: Professor Ferran/Fernando Rodriguez-Valls for an entry interview
- Pass CSET LOTE Subtest III Language and Communication for Korean, Mandarin, and Vietnamese or CSET LOTE Subtest II for Khmer
- Take 2 course requirements. These courses are only available to teacher candidates who have been admitted to the teaching credential program, are currently in the teaching credential program, or they have completed their teaching credential program. Teachers holding a credentialed could also be admitted to the program with completion of the first two requirements.
