

The following courses can be completed to satisfy the subject matter competency requirements for the Single Subject Social Science or Education Specialist (Jr. or High School setting) Credential Programs. You may satisfy subject matter competency by:

- 1) Completing all the coursework as listed below. (Note: Only courses listed below or its equivalent (assist.org) will be accepted) OR
- 2) Completing all courses for a specific subtest(s) in combination with a passing score(s) on the other CSET subtests for social sciences.

All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher (CR or P is also acceptable). Course requirements may also be met with the following: passing score on equivalent AP or IB exams, articulated community college courses, or CLEP exams.

INSTRUCTIONS

If you are a current CSUF student or alum:

- Complete these forms according to the tips below. Courses can be in progress at the time of application. However, please note that final grades will be required to verify subject matter competency, and all courses must be completed prior to the start of the credential program.
- Upload the completed forms along with a Titan Degree Audit (TDA) or copies of official transcripts to your Cal State Apply application for the credential program. A signature by an advisor at the bottom of the form is not required at the time of application.

If you are an applicant who completed your degree outside of CSUF:

• Reach out to your alma matter where you received your bachelor's degree and inquire if your major department can conduct a coursework evaluation. Documentation of approved coursework evaluations by other institutions must have a formal signature completed by a credential analyst or approved SMC signer from that institution. A signed coursework option from another institution will not automatically be accepted and will be subject to a review by CSUF Credential Admissions.

Tips for completing the coursework evaluation forms:

- **Required course**: The courses listed (or equivalent, such as an articulated community college course) are the specific courses that must be completed to meet each requirement. If you believe you have completed the requirement with a course not included on the list, you must submit course syllabi with this document so that the course can be reviewed for approval.
- Course or exam completed: Enter the course or exam you completed for each requirement.
- **Completed @ (institution**): Enter the institution at which the course was completed. If the requirement was met by equivalent exam, enter the exam taken.
- **Semester completed (Sem/Yr):** Enter the term the course was completed (for example Fall 2024). If the requirement was met by equivalent exam, enter the date the exam was taken.
- Grade or score received: If the course is currently in progress, then enter "IP."
