# COMMUNITY COLLEGE PREREQUISITES CLASSES

## For Admission to CSUF-IPTSE

- ◆ Maintain a GPA of 2.8 or higher
- ◆ Complete required Prerequisite Classes (See chart)
- ◆ Complete GE requirements

## At The Community College:

- ◆ **Fall of your first year:**
  - See your Community College academic counselor for a study plan
- ◆ **Spring of your first year:**
  - Attend a mandatory IPTSE overview
- ◆ **Fall of your second year:**
  - Apply to CSUF by November
  - Attend required overview at CSUF
- ◆ **Spring of your second year:**
  - Meet your CAS academic advisor
  - Accept admission to CSUF
